## Adam Dance

#### TELLS US WHY HE'S STANDING TO BE THE NEXT MP FOR YEOVIL

It's a sunny summer day and we are taking a walk along a wooded path in Nine Springs, Yeovil. As we walk, Adam tells me what inspired him to stand as Yeovil's MP.

"I have been active in this community from a young age. Having been born and brought up in South Petherton, I love living and working here. And I know the area like the back of my hand.

It's always better to have an MP who understands the local community and can respond quickly to calls for help. We've been fortunate in the past to have an MP like Paddy Ashdown who showed us the way to do it."

"I have been active in this community from a young age." Adam's community involvement started when he was a teenager. The youth club in which he was involved was threatened with closure. Many disadvantaged youngsters would be left without their social hub. He led the opposition to the closure. arguing his case at a public meeting after which the decision was reversed. His community-based values have only grown stronger since those days.

When I ask about the skills and knowledge he brings to the job, Adam is quick to respond.

"People skills. I enjoy talking to people and helping to solve their problems. Having been a local councillor at every level, I have learnt how to use bodies like parish councils and the new Somerset Council to get things done.



As an MP I will have the weight of Parliament behind me to tackle the bigger issues that affect the economy and community of Yeovil."

Adam works extremely hard to win elections. He has leadership roles where he delivers for the community.

As well as being a councillor for South Petherton & Islemoor, he has the portfolio for Public Health at Somerset Council and is a Governor of Yeovil Hospital.

"We are seeing our public services decline." Adam is clearly angry with the way the Conservative government has treated us.

"The cost of living is now hitting everyone in their pocket. and the effects are being felt in very practical ways such as the weekly shop and monthly mortgage payments. Many more children have fallen into poverty. We are seeing our public services in decline, with not enough doctors, dentists, nurses, or midwives. It's just not right for people to suffer in this way."

"Even the environment is off the Conservative agenda now."

As a landscape gardener Adam has learned to respect the natural environment and he is passionate about protecting it.

"Our five main rivers in Somerset are all severely polluted. For years, the government has turned a blind eye to sewage discharges by the private water companies, fouling our rivers and beaches."

Adam is also concerned about the damage done to the environment through the overuse of plastics, the burning of fossil fuels and the waste of our natural resources.

"We have the good fortune to live in a beautiful county. We need to protect the countryside and work to make renewable energy our main source of power. I will campaign for government funding to install solar panels and charging points, so that everyone has fair access to clean energy."

### 'I needed to see my GP urgently but couldn't get an appointment'

Adam Dance's top priority is standing up for our NHS. He will help local residents struggling to get the urgent help they need

There is no issue closer to Adam's heart than our NHS. He has seen how years of Conservative underinvestment, record waiting lists, and GP and dentist shortages have left people in Somerset deeply concerned about the future of their health care system.

Having waited over 50 minutes to speak to a receptionist.

"I have great sympathy for residents who cannot get appointments. In my role as a governor of Yeovil Hospital I am doing all I can to improve things. The NHS is my top priority."

"This week I spoke to a sick resident who was urgently trying to book an appointment to see his GP. Having waited for over 50 minutes to speak to a receptionist. When he eventually got through he was told that there were no appointments for the next 16 weeks. That is totally unacceptable."

"This experience is being repeated every day across the country. For many who need an urgent diagnosis and treatment it can be too late. The backlog of operations and



appointments means that many people are suffering. Staff are stretched to the limit and more money is desperately needed in our surgeries and hospitals. The government has yet again failed to give our local hospital in Yeovil extra funding, even though our near neighbours have benefited from a share of £250m. Why doesn't our current MP lobby hard for Yeovil residents?"
